- Analysis of the conceptual and methodological tools for the construction of assessment instruments in psychology in the context of intervention. Course:

- Analysis of the theory and the qualitative and quantitative research and its application to the psychology with interdisciplinary nuances. Course:
  - Research Methodology
- Analysis of the main theoretical proposals with regard to the evolutionary stages that the individual goes through from conception until death. Course:
  - Developmental Psychology
- Analysis of the nature and form of the Mexican people from different perspectives such as psychological, anthropological, psychoanalytical, and research that has been carried out in the area of the Mexican ethnic psychology. Course:
  - Psychology of the Mexican people
- Analysis of the characterization of the groups, as well as their formation process, and their various forms of intervention. Course:
  - 4 Group Behavior Seminar

6) Analysis of the main theoretical proposals of the social community psychology as a discipline that studies jointly the human person and the social environment for the purpose of designing psychological interventions that promote human development.
