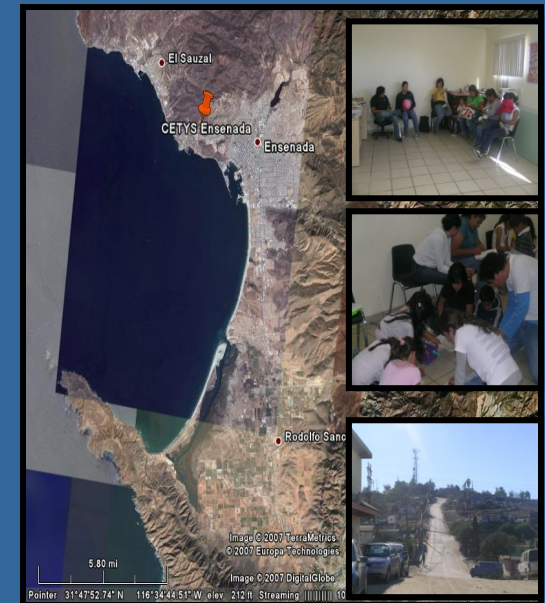
The project is a product of two major factors:

CETYS is located at a growing population zone, with high diversity of families from different income levels.

- The new library will be open for anyone who needs information resources.
- We have identified at least 15 schools within CETYS' surrounding area, all of their students will have access to the Community Library.

# Project overview

- Total and free of charge access to the community.
- Three level building, located at the heart of the Campus.
- Total surface of construction: 15,260 sqft., built in 10 months.
- Storage capacity: 52,000 books.
- Occupants capacity: 350 people.
- 200,000+ visits per year, including website visits (Forecast).
- Total Investment: \$1'200,000 dlls.
- Features: Handicapped friendly access, video surveillance system, fire extinguishing system, wi-fi infrastructure (internet).

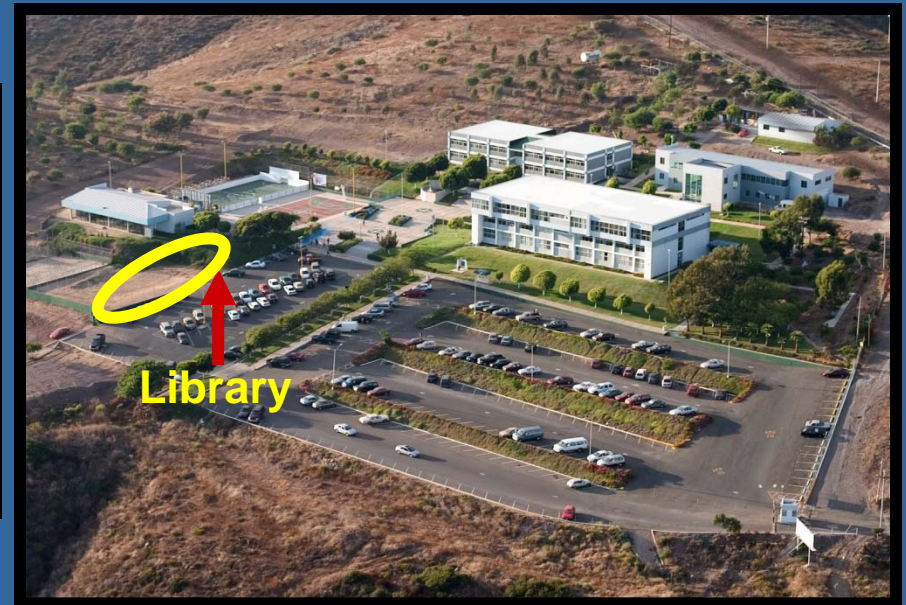

**2005** Need awareness and feasibility analysis

**2006-2007** Project development; initially considered in two constructive phases

**2006-2009** Fundraising effort

**2007-2008** Several meetings with Fundación Ensenada

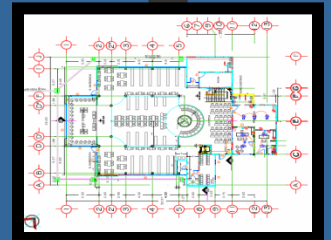
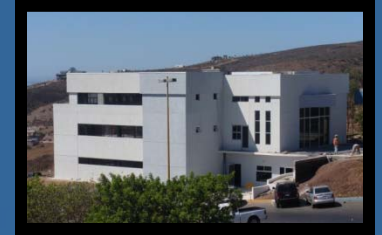
**2008** (February) Ground breaking ceremony and construction beginning

**2008** (June) Receipt and investment of Fundación Ensenada gift. \$187,500dlls

**2008** (July) IENAC's decision to go straight to the second phase, this meant a harder fundraising effort and a pledge of \$400,000dlls directly from our Trustees

**2008** (December) End of construction, equipment installation

**2009** (April 28) Opening ceremony

**1st level.** Main book display, operative zone, reference station, individual and group reading area, photocopy stations, audiovisual room(20 users), computer stations, archive space, technological features such: Digitalization or archive scanning service, map library, newspaper Library.

**2nd level.** Main entrance with Lobby area for reception and exhibitions (Community Pavilion), reading terrace, book display, photocopy and office supply's store, reference station, reserved material area, group study rooms.

**3rd level.** Interactive learning room, Mexico-India Center, finance laboratory, media laboratory.

All levels include internet and database access, elevator, restrooms, safety equipment and a spectacular ocean view.

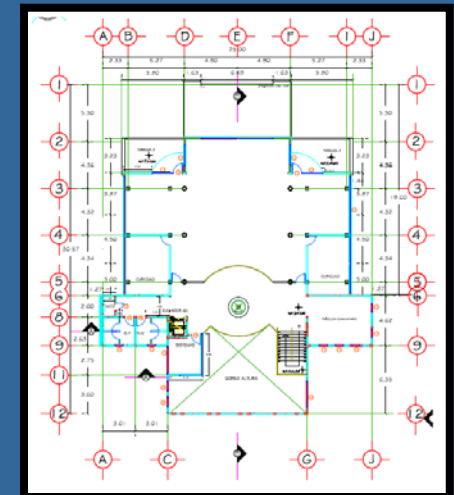
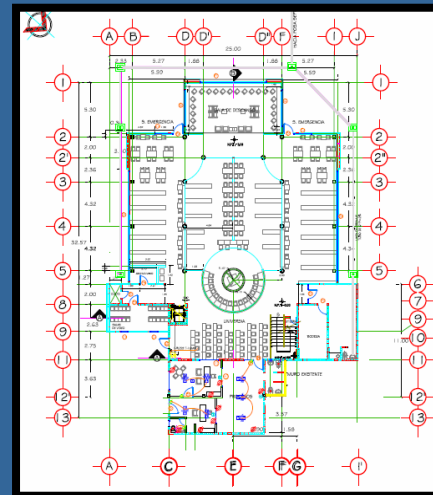
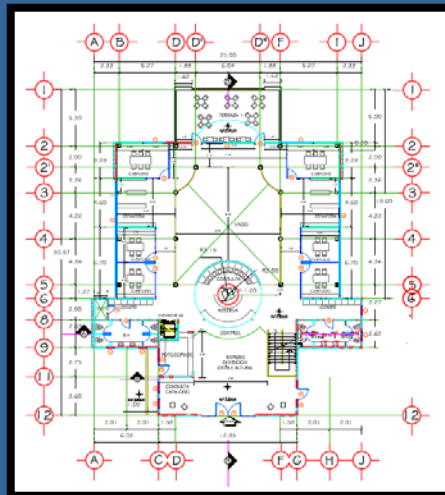
